JeeYoon Choi, a native of South Korea, is the Director of Music and Organist at the First (Scots) Presbyterian Church, Charleston, South Carolina. She began studying organ with HeeSung Kim at the Ewha Women's University in Seoul, and holds a D.M.A. from Boston University, studying under James David Christie, and a M.M. from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey, studying under Stefan Engels.

In October 2006, Dr. Choi was a guest speaker for the annual Karg-Elert conference held in Leipzig, Germany, presenting "Karg-Elert's Use of Lutheran Chorale and Gregorian Chant in His Organ Music." Also, her article on the same topic was published by *The Karg-Elert Arhchive*, London, in September 2006.



Her most recent accomplishments include First Prize in the 2004 Elizabeth Elftman Organ Competition, and First Prize in the 2001 Strader Organ Competition. She was also selected as the recipient of The Peter B. Knock Memorial Music Award of 2004.

Dr. Choi has given recitals in the *L'Organo Series* at the Piccolo Spoleto Festival in Charleston, SC, and at the following places: the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in Milwaukee; the Church of the Immaculate Conception at the Jesuit Urban Center in Boston; Adolph Busch Hall at Harvard University; the Church of the Advent, King's Chapel, Boston; Marsh Chapel, Boston; the Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, New York City; the Central Congregational Church, Newtonville MA; the AIDS Benefit Recital at All Saints' Church, in Millington, NJ; St. Mark's Methodist Church in Trenton, NJ; Christ Church Cathedral, in Cincinnati; and at Westminster Choir College for the 2001 Commencement. She is planning a series of organ recitals in Charleston, New York City, and Germany for the 2008-2009 seasons.

Dr. Choi has served as Director of Music at several churches in New Jersey and in the Boston area, and has also taught organ at Boston University; she served as a pianist for the University Chorale at Boston College.

Dear AGO members.

As you know, Columbia has been chosen to be the host city for Region IV's AGO Pipe Organ Encounter June 13-18, 2010. The POE committee has been working very hard to make this an awesome week for high school kids ages 13-18 who want to learn more about the organ. We already have in place a wonderful faculty and venues for the week along with 19 students (our maximum number of students is 20) already registered.

We need your help. We have several needs which I am hoping you can help fill.

- 1. <u>Chaperones</u>—We need chaperones, both male and female, who are willing to either spend the night at LTSS or chaperone during the day. If you can chaperone for a few days during the week (or the entire week), please let someone on the committee know. This is very important. We **cannot** function without chaperones. Faculty cannot function as chaperones.
- 2. <u>Vans with Drivers</u>—If your church has a van or bus (minimum of 10 passengers), we are in need of 3 for each day of the week (Monday through Friday morning). If you can't drive, possibly consider a retired person in your choir or church to drive. AGO is fully insured. The insurance documents can be easily furnished to your church. "The policy covers, in excess over the vehicle's [pre-existing] coverage, any vehicle, be it a van or bus. The coverage is automatic as long as the vehicle is being used solely for the purpose of AGO business only. In summary, the Hired and Non-Owned Liability coverage covers \$1,000,000 of liability in the event that a vehicle used on official AGO business is involved in an accident. The \$1,000,000 covers the damage to other vehicles, property or individuals. This coverage is in excess of the vehicle's current insurance, carried by the owner of the vehicle. Any vehicle and driver has this excess coverage as long as the vehicle is being used solely for AGO business."
- **3. Zoo Tickets** One of our outings is going to be going to the Riverbanks Zoo for an afternoon of fun. If you or a family member/friend are a member of the zoo, please consider donating a few tickets for us to use. We will have 20 participants, 10 faculty, plus chaperones. Every ticket you can donate is one less the chapter has to purchase.

With your help, this week should be a great experience for the students. Please contact myself or another member of the POE committee with your questions and to volunteer.

Dr. Payne was a member of the Greater Columbia Chapter of the AGO while she was in Columbia and served as a Member at Large and Sub-Dean.


Dorothy Katherine Payne, Distinguished Professor Emerita of Music Theory and former Dean of the School of Music at the University of South Carolina (1994-1998), passed away on March 11 at Llanfair Retirement Community in Cincinnati, Ohio. She was 75, and had suffered from Parkinson's disease for several years.

A native of Cincinnati, Dorothy received undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Eastman School of music, where she later taught theory and ear training. She also taught at Pacific Lutheran University and the University of Texas, and chaired the music departments at the University of Connecticut and the University of Arizona. She was a regular consultant for the Educational Testing Service and served on the Executive Board and Accreditation Board for the National Association of Schools of Music. She was co-author of Tonal Harmony, a best-selling college theory text, and she received Teaching Excellence awards from Eastman, the University of SC School of Music, and the University of Texas. She also served for several years as organist at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Columbia, and performed regularly with her siblings in their biennial family piano recitals.

Dorothy was renowned as a teacher and beloved by her students, her colleagues, and her friends. She was known for her generosity, her quick wit both in and out of the classroom, and her passion for teaching.

A memorial service will be held in Cincinnati. Memorials are preferred to the Dorothy S. Payne Scholarship Fund c/o the Greater Cincinnati Foundation, 200 West Fourth Street, Cincinnati, OH 45202; Hospice of Cincinnati, Inc., P.O. Box 633597, Cincinnati, OH 45263; and the Dorothy K. She is survived by her brother and sister-in-law, Karl Payne and Susan Rivers-Payne of Cincinnati, and by her sister and brother-in-law, Rebecca and John Shockley of Minneapolis.
