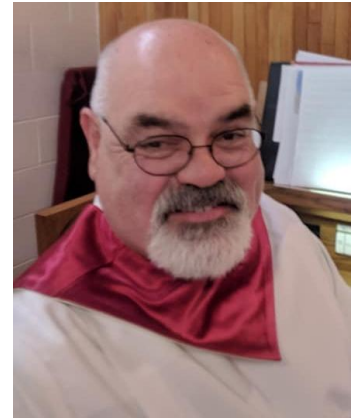
The voting will take place by an emailed ballot sent to all current voting members and returned by email or mail by the noted deadline.

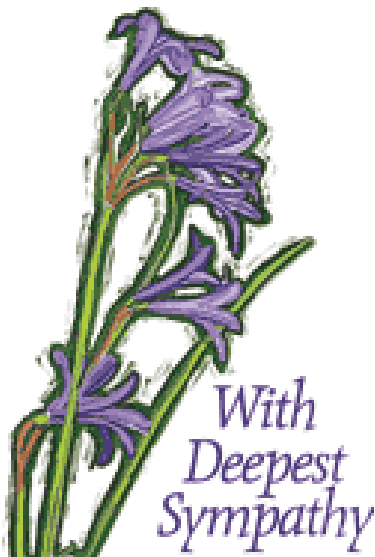

Second Place (\$2000) Aidan Yau (Pleasanton, CA) a student of Angela Kraft Cross

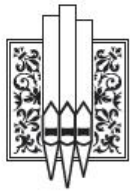
Third Place (\$1500) Amir Liam Sahay (New York, NY) a student of Eddie Zheng

Former Canon Organist and Choirmaster of Trinity Cathedral named as Director of Music at Washington National Cathedral

Washington National Cathedral has announced the appointment of Dr. Jared Johnson as Director of Music and Canon-Elect. Dr. Johnson, currently serving as Canon Director of Music at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, will assume his new role in summer 2026, bringing his extensive expertise in choral leadership, organ performance, and sacred music education.



In this position, Dr. Johnson will oversee the Cathedral's renowned music program, including direction of the Cathedral Choir, organ performances, and the broader liturgical and concert offerings that enhance worship and welcome visitors from across the country and around the world.

Dr. Jared Johnson expressed his enthusiasm for the new role: "It is an honor to be called to Washington National Cathedral, a true beacon of faith and music. It will be a privilege to carry on the work of so many good souls before me, in a place with a commitment to sacred music that is difficult to match in our country. The Cathedral has inspired me throughout my career – from attending my first Evensong as a student, to bringing my choirs for visits, and later sharing its majesty with my own children as pilgrims. It is a special joy for my family to come to Washington, DC, my wife's hometown, where we will be surrounded by close family and friends."

AGO members will remember Dr. Johnson who served as Canon Organist and Choirmaster at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Columbia, S.C. from 2003 – 2023.

Recapping the February Program

On Saturday, February 7, the chapter held a workshop entitled *Painting the Text: Bringing Hymns off the Page*, presented by organist Nicholas Quardokus of Charleston, SC. The event took place at Mount Tabor Lutheran Church in West Columbia, SC. The workshop explored how touch, registration, and (re)harmonization can shine a light on a hymn's textual lyricism and drama. Nicholas is the Canon Organist and Director of Music at Grace Church Cathedral in Charleston, SC. He holds Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in organ performance from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music and the Yale University Institute of Sacred Music, respectively, and has earned top prizes in competitions around the country.
