Jordan DeRouen serves as Organist and Choirmaster for the historic Basilica of St. Peter in Columbia SC. He earned the Bachelor of Sacred Music at Northwestern State University in Natchitoches LA, where he studied organ with Mary de Ville, and the Master of Music in Organ Performance from Southern Methodist University in Dallas TX, studying with renowned concert artist Stefan Engels. Jordan has also participated in the French Organ Music Seminar (FOMS), where he has been able to receive instruction from some of the most influential organists in the world. Additionally, he has received numerous scholarship awards from the seminar in both composition and improvisation. Mr. DeRouen has performed throughout the USA and Europe, including the Vatican Basilica of St. Peter in Rome, and the Cathedral of St. Patrick in New York City.

Catawba College - Salisbury, North Carolina

Catawba College is a small, faith-based (UCC), liberal arts college located about 45 miles north of Charlotte in the quaint town of Salisbury, NC. The 1000-seat Omwake-Dearborn Chapel, named for two former college presidents, is now 55 years old. At the time of the dedication, an electronic organ was in place but was later replaced by a 42 rank 3 manual Casavant pipe organ. Over the years, the pipe organ fell into disrepair and its baroque tonality fell out of favor. Several attempts were made to either repair the Casavant or replace it. Al Murrell, Vice President of R. A. Daffer Church Organs, Inc., built a strong relationship with Professor Paul Oakley and his successor Dr. Phillip Burgess by providing Rodgers Organs for their annual service of lessons and carols. Because of the relationship Al built over the years with college personnel, R.A.Daffer Church Organs, Inc was chosen to build and install the new four manual 84 stop Rodgers Organ. In addition, 17 ranks of the existing Casavant Organ were incorporated into the new instrument. The project which includes new wind chests will be completed in April of 2019. We wish to thank Dr. Phillip Burgess, Associate Chair of Music and

Mr. Bill Graham, Chair of Trustees for putting their trust in our company for this project. The new instrument will enrich the weddings and services that are held in this exquisite chapel for many year

In March of 2020, the Young Organist Competition will celebrate its 10th anniversary. The winner from 2011, the first year of the competition, will return to Columbia and perform a recital. Jacob Reed, whose biography appears below, will present a concert at Trinity Cathedral on Friday evening, March 6. The competition will take place on Saturday, March 7 at Shandon United Methodist Church.

Jacob Reed is the first student ever to receive a simultaneous BA/MA in musicology from Yale University (double major in mathematics) where he studied organ first with Thomas Murray and then with Martin Jean and harpsichord with Arthur Haas. Born in Oxford, England, and raised in Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Jacob was a 2013 U.S. Presidential Scholar, and was selected as a 2013 YoungArts National Finalist by the National YoungArts Foundation – one of 152 finalists out of nearly 10,000 applicants, and the only organist among the 19 classical musicians. Over



the past several years, he has given recitals across the United States, Europe, and Canada. In addition to his solo, ensemble and church service playing as an organist, Jacob has also performed frequently as a soloist, accompanist, and chamber musician on piano, harpsichord, and viola da gamba. At Yale, he was a member of the Yale Temperament Viol Consort, instrumentalist and vocalist for the Yale Collegium Musicum, and first harpsichordist for the Yale Baroque Opera Project. Jacob was artist-in-residence as organist and pianist at the 2016 and 2017 iterations of the Uncommon Music Festival in Sitka, Alaska. Appointed in the fall of 2017, Jacob has been the Organ Scholar at Grace Episcopal Church in New York City for the past two years. Jacob was the winner of the first Young Organist Competition (2011) and will perform a recital at Trinity Cathedral in Columbia SC on March 6, 2020.
