Meet our January Presenter Jan Kraybill

GRAMMY-nominated artist Jan Kraybill is a concert organist, pianist, and harpsichordist. As an educator, church musician, speaker, and consultant, she is an enthusiastic cheerleader for the power of music to change lives for the better. In addition to maintaining an active concert schedule, she is organ conservator at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City, Missouri, organist-inresidence at the international headquarters of Community of Christ in Independence, Missouri; and organist at Village on Antioch Presbyterian Church in Overland Park. Kansas

Throughout her career Dr. Kraybill has performed as both а solo and collaborative musician and taught workshops on a variety of topics. She has been a featured artist and teacher at regional and national AGO and ACDA conventions as well as the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, and has been heard on many broadcasts of Pipedreams. She has collaborated with manv ensembles. includina the GRAMMY-winning Kansas City Chorale, the GRAMMY-nominated Kansas City Symphony and Symphony Chorus. Several of her solo CDs and collaborative recordings are available, including The Orchestral Organ, which received three nominations for GRAMMY awards in 2020. includina Best Classical Instrumental Solo.

Dr. Kraybill holds degrees in music education and piano and organ



performance from Kansas State University and the Conservatory of Music and Dance in Kansas City. In 2010 she achieved the distinction of Fellow of the AGO. She has served in many local, regional, and national roles in the AGO, The Hymn Society, and the Master Teacher Institute, most recently as Executive Director of The Hymn Society in the U.S. and Canada.

Catching Up with YOC Alumni Alden Wright First Place Winner 2014

Since winning first place in the 2014 Young Organist Competition, Alden Wright completed the Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees from Eastman School of Music where he studied with Nathan Laube. He garnered the prestigious Performer's Certificate and graduated with highest distinction in May 2020.

A native of Salisbury, North Carolina, he began organ studies in



2012, following years of piano studies. His first organ teacher was Dr. Philip Burgess of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Salisbury. He was a recipient of the Robert and Ann Stigall Scholarship sponsored by the Charlotte AGO Chapter in 2013 and 2014. In 2014 Alden won first place in the Columbia AGO Young Organist Competition. He was the first-place winner of the University of North Carolina School of the Arts Organ Competition in 2016. In 2019 he won the First Prize and the Audience Prize in the Arthur Poister Competition in Organ Playing and was awarded the Pogorzelski-Yankee Memorial Scholarship for undergraduate studies. Alden has performed in many student and solo recitals throughout the country and has participated in masterclasses with many of the world's top performers.

Since the age of 14, he has served as a church organist. He served as organist at Milford Hills United Methodist Church in his hometown of Salisbury from 2015-2016 and as intern at Christ Church - Episcopal in Rochester, NY, under the Roy E. VanDelinder Fellowship from 2016-2018. There he was a member of the Schola Cantorum. As a passionate church musician, Alden developed his knowledge of liturgical music through programs such as the Royal School of Church Music's Carolina Course, hosted at Duke University, where he served as Organ Scholar in the summer of 2019 working with our own Dr. Jared Johnson. From 2018-2020, he served as Assistant Organist to Director of Music Peter DuBois at Third Presbyterian Church in Rochester. He served as organist at the United Church (Presbyterian-American Baptist) in Canandaigua NY for a year. There he started the tradition of the congregation remaining seated for the postlude.

Following his studies at Eastman, Alden served as Organ Scholar at Truro Cathedral in Cornwall (England) under Director of Music Christopher Gray for the 2021-22 academic year. There he accompanied daily services and assisted in training the boy choristers. Alden participated in the 32nd St. Albans International Organ Competition in April 2023. He was a semi-finalist in the interpretation portion of the competition which included a newly commissioned work by the celebrated British composer Judith Weir.

In September of this year, Alden accepted the position of Associate Director of Music at Christ Church, Pittsford (New York).

Dr. David Lowry and Frances Webb journeyed to Charlotte in June 2019 to hear Alden in a magnificent performance of a program which included the "Prelude, Adagio, et Choral Varié on the theme Véni Creator", Op. 4 by Maurice Duruflé. Performed completely from memory, the performance left them astonished at the musical maturity and virtuosity of such a young performer and so very proud of our chapter's part in the blossoming of his career as a concert organist.






