Ron Carter, a veteran theater organist in the Atlanta area, delights his audiences with artful portrayals of characters, emotions, and onscreen action through his improvisatory accompaniment. Ron is from Marietta, GA, where he has served as Organist/Music Director in churches for over 50 years. As an active member of the American Theater Organ Society (ATOS), Ron has presented numerous theatre organ concerts and silent film accompaniments throughout the southeast. He has received many awards in the



field of theater organ, including 2009 Lifetime Achievement Award from the Atlanta Chapter of ATOS. Currently, Ron is the theatre organ consultant for Allen Organ Studios of Atlanta, and the House Organist for the Earl and Rachel Smith Strand Theatre in Marietta, GA.

Catching Up with YOC Alumni Bruce Xu, 2017 YOC Winner

Bruce Xu, now a student at Rice University in Houston, Texas, is a native of Sloatsburg, New York. He was first introduced to the organ at the Methodist church in his hometown. Soon thereafter, he began lessons at age 9 with Jimrae Lenser and then continued with Craig Williams, organist at West Point Academy. Bruce then entered the high school program at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA) where he studied organ performance with Dr. Timothy Olsen. Concurrently he completed his organist internship at Augsburg Lutheran Church in Winston-Salem, N.C.



Bruce won the UNCSA/Salem College High School Organ Competition in 2017. That same year, he was invited as a rising star to perform at the 2019 American Guild of Organists National Conference in Kansas City. In the Spring/Summer of 2017, Bruce won First Prize in six organ competitions: UNCSA/Salem College High Organ Competition; School Greater Columbia (S.C.) AGO Chapter Young Organist Competition: East Carolina University Young Artist Competition; AGO Quimby/RCYO Chapter Competition in Atlanta GA; and AGO Quimby/RCYO Regional Competition in Jacksonville FL.

Following high school, Bruce enrolled at Rice University in the Shepherd School of Music where he was an organ performance major studying with Professor Ken Cowan. 2022 was a banner year for Bruce in his organ career. On June 3, 2022, he won First Prize (\$3000) in the Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition. On June 9, 2022, he won First Prize and the Audience Prize at the 10th edition of the Quebec Organ Competition. This was followed September 2022 by capturing first prize and the audience prize at the Albert

Schweitzer Organ Festival in Hartford, Connecticut.

Bruce ('24) has switched to a major in Business Management and Finance in the Jones Graduate School of Business at Rice University; however, he continues to perform and serve churches. Presently, he serves a Presbyterian church in the Woodlands area near Houston.

His favorite thing about music is that it can be a source of expression, therapy, empathy, and connection. "I think music is such a beautiful thing in this world, and I feel grateful to have the ability to play the organ, sing, and play in musical groups; hopefully for as long as possible."





The New Lincoln Organ St. John's Anglican Church, Florence, S. C.

The history of St. John's parish, established in 1866, predates Florence. Their current worship edifice was constructed in 1889. The Lincoln organ is the third known organ, the first being a 1911 Hinners organ, which was replaced in 1939 by Möller Opus 6803. This organ, with additions and modifications, served the congregation until it was removed in January 2022 for work to begin on their new instrument.

In 2017 Aeolian-Skinner Opus 1338 was purchased for the nucleus of a new organ for St. John's parish. The fifteen - rank instrument had served First United Methodist Church, Starkville, Mississippi, from 1956 until it was replaced by a digital organ. It was the intent of St. John's to create a new organ in the style of Aeolian-Skinner, and the opportunity to begin with the Starkville organ was a tremendous boost.

The contract was signed in January 2020 for a new instrument built by



Lincoln Pipe Organs, Inc., of Lincolnton, N.C. With slight modifications, this instrument has been built as a four division organ (Great, Swell, Choir, and Pedal) with 37 pipe ranks and 23 digital voices. The Great organ has one digital voice (the 16') and utilizes four ranks of the Aeolian-Skinner; the Swell organ is entirely pipe (and almost completely Aeolian-Skinner); the Choir organ is Walker digital (Aeolian-Skinner and Skinner samples); and the Pedal organ is a pipe-digital combination.

The console is French terraced drawknob to give the organist-choirmaster better visibility for choral conducting, and is movable.

Great and Pedal divisions are exposed on the east wall, and the Swell (with some pedal) is in the chamber on the south wall of the Chancel.

Five ranks of the Möller were used: the former Dulciana was revoiced as a celeste for the Aeolian-Skinner Flauto Dolce on the Great; the string and string celeste were used in the Swell organ as a Dolce Celeste II, 32 pipes of the Melodia became the Flute Cantique 4' in the Pedal organ; and the Bourdon is in the Pedal organ at 16' and 8' pitch. Immediately after the contract was signed in January 2020, the Covid pandemic struck, closing suppliers that were needed for the organ's construction. Then, when preparations were being made to the historic church building, structural defects were discovered in the North wall of the Nave. These setbacks turned what St. John's hoped would be a 6-month project into a nearly 4-year project! St. John's parish is overjoyed to now be able to enjoy the organ and their restored church. The organ was first played in public worship on November 5, 2023 and dedicated on January 13-14, 2024, with Joby Bell playing the dedicatory recitals. (Specifications listed on next page)
