Meet our January Presenter Jan Kraybill

GRAMMY-nominated artist Jan Kraybill is a concert organist, pianist and harpsichordist. As an educator, church musician, speaker, and consultant, she is an enthusiastic cheerleader for the power of music to change lives for the better. In addition to maintaining an active concert schedule, she is organ conservator at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City, Missouri; organist-in-residence at the international headquarters of Community of Christ in Independence, Missouri; and organist at Village on Antioch Presbyterian Church in Overland Park, Kansas

Throughout her career Dr. Kraybill has performed as both a solo and collaborative musician and taught workshops on a variety of topics. She has been a featured artist and teacher at regional and national AGO and ACDA conventions as well as the Hymn Society in the United States and Canada, and has been heard on many broadcasts of Pipedreams. She has collaborated with many ensembles, including the GRAMMYwinning Kansas City Chorale, GRAMMY-nominated Kansas Citv Symphony and Symphony Chorus. Several of her solo CDs and collaborative recordings are available, including The Orchestral Organ, which received three nominations for GRAMMY awards in 2020, including Best Classical Instrumental Solo.

Dr. Kraybill holds degrees in music education and piano and organ performance from Kansas State University and the Conservatory of Music and Dance in Kansas City. In 2010 she achieved the



distinction of Fellow of the AGO. She has served in many local, regional, and national roles in the AGO, The Hymn Society, and the Master Teacher Institute, most recently as Executive Director of The Hymn Society in the U.S. and Canada.

Catching Up with YOC Alumni Clara Gerdes Bartz, 2014 Competition

Clara Gerdes Bartz, from Davidson, North Carolina, is a 2021 graduate of the Yale Institute of Sacred Music where she studied with Martin Jean. She recently graduated from the Curtis Institute of Music where she studied with Alan Morrison, also receiving diplomas in Early Music and Improvisation. She received first prizes in the Albert Schweitzer, AGO-Quimby Mid-Atlantic Regional and UNCSA School of the Arts organ competition. She was the recipient of the 2020 Baker Prize in Organ Performances and the 2021 Julia Sherman Award for excellence in Organ Playing from Yale and she received the first annual Pogorzelski-Yankee scholarship from the American Guild of Organists.

Clara began her organ study with Jane Cain at Davidson College Presbyterian Church. In 2013 she participated in the AGO Pipe Organ Encounter - Advanced at the Eastman School of Music. She also studied organ with Dr. Isabelle Demers at Baylor University in June 2013. She placed first in the UNCSA-Salem College High School Competition from 2010 to 2014. For the YOC 2014, Clara performed the complete Trio Sonata in D minor, BWV 527 by J.S. Bach and *Transports de Joie* by Olivier Messiaen - both selections from memory. Although she received second prize in the 2014 Young Organist Competition in Columbia, audience members agreed that she should have shared first prize with the declared winner



Alden Wright, featured in last month's AGO newsletter.

In 2021, Clara performed the dedication concert of the new organ at Philadelphia Episcopal Cathedral and closing recital at the East Texas Pipe Organ Festival in New Orleans, LA. She has been a featured performer at the 2021 AGO National OrganFest, 2018 AGO National Convention, 2017 AGO Regional Convention and the 2019 National Conference of the Church Music Association of America, as well as Spoleto Festival USA, Oregon Bach Festival, Philadelphia International Festival of the Arts and the Uncommon Music Festival in Sitka, Alaska. Clara has given recitals at a variety of churches and cathedrals around the country, most notably the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and Washington National Cathedral.

Pre-COVID, Clara served as Assistant Organist at Saint Bartholomew's Church, Park Avenue in New York City and was previously Organ Scholar at Saint Mark's Church, Locust Street in Philadelphia. She now serves as Director of Music at Most Holy Redeemer and Nativity Parish in Manhattan, New York, where her responsibilities include overseeing the restoration of the parish's 1891 Roosevelt organ. Most recently, Clara was appointed as adjunct instructor of organ at Westminster Choir College (Princeton NJ).



The 2024 Furman University Church Music Conference January 16-18

This year's Thomson Church Music Lecture series will feature clinician Tom Trenney and guest artist **Ariel Merivil** (piano and voice).

Composer, conductor, organist, preacher, and teacher Tom Trenney has been blessed to serve as Minister of Music to First-Plymouth Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, since 2009. In 2019, he became Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choirs at Nebraska Wesleyan University. Tom's choirs have been honored to perform for state, regional, and national conventions of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), and they have been award winners in the American Prize for choral ensembles. He serves as Music in Worship Chair for Midwest ACDA.


Tom has been a featured performer at churches, colleges, and concert halls across the country including Philadelphia's Kimmel Center, Seattle's Benaroya Hall, Kansas City's Kauffman Center, Kennedy Center, and Carnegie Hall. His choral compositions are published by Augsburg Fortress, Beckenhorst Press, Choristers Guild, E.C. Schirmer/Galaxy, MorningStar, MusicSpoke, Pavane, and G. Schirmer. His piece *From Generation to Generation* won the Raabe Prize from the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians in 2023.

A graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Eastman School of Music, Tom is grateful for the inspiration of his teachers and mentors – especially Anton Armstrong, David Davidson, Craig Hella Johnson, (Mister) Fred Rogers, William Weinert, Anne Wilson and Todd Wilson.






