The Columbia Baroque Soloists will present their Summer Institute Concert, *Playing in the French Manner*, on Monday, July 9, at 6:30 p.m. in the Recital Hall at the University of South Carolina School of Music, 813 Assembly St. in Columbia.

The performance will feature French Baroque music from the reigns of King Louis XIV, XV and XVI. In the French Baroque, music appealed to the emotions directly through color and sound. The concert will emphasize the subtle beauty of French ornamentation, in which the ornaments are written as symbols in the music. The purpose of French ornamentation is to sustain and enhance the melodic line, creating a lyrical style emphasizing serenity and elegance. The concert will feature music by the some of the most important composers of the French Baroque including Francois Couperin, Marin Marais, Jean-Philippe Rameau and Jacques-Martin Hotteterre.

Columbia Baroque Soloists is comprised of South Carolina's leading early music specialists including Jerry Curry, harpsichordist and distinguished Professor Emeritus at the University of South Carolina; Jean Hein, Baroque recorders; Brittnee Siemon, mezzo soprano; Timothy Hein, Baroque recorders and Gail Ann Schroeder, viola da gamba. The ensemble performs on instruments of the period at authentic low-pitch and temperament, in varying combinations of voice, recorder, gamba and harpsichord.

The Columbia Baroque Soloists Summer Institute is a five-week Master Class in Baroque Recorder and Harpsichord led by Jean Hein, Baroque Recorder and Dr. Jerry Curry, Historic Keyboards. The Institute begins on July 2 and runs through July 30 on Monday evenings from 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the Choral Rehearsal Room at the USC School of Music.

I have a Vocalian reed organ, with a single keyboard. It is about 50% restored, Cabinet is finished. Bellows is finished. I have already bought all the leather and felt and all the pads for the chest are cut out and ready to install. My buddy and I were redoing the organ as a project. He has lost interest and I don't have anywhere to keep the organ. It is a beautiful piece in tiger oak. It has a bank of faux pipes mounted to the top and there are four sets of reeds in the chest. Only two reeds are missing. Even the reed puller is in the organ. I have all the screws and parts. It is in 100% there condition, but taken apart into its major components. It is on its way to the landfill at the end of the month.

The organ is FREE. You provide transportation.
