AGO EXPANDS ACCESS TO LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP

Eleven Individuals Have Made a Commitment to Lifetime Membership in the Guild since the Membership Category Was Created in 2009

The American Guild of Organists (AGO) is proud to offer a new membership category for individuals who wish to make a commitment to the AGO for life. Lifetime Membership was approved by the AGO National Council as a pilot program in 2009. The opportunity to enroll in Lifetime Membership is now extended to all at the start of the 2010–2011 membership year.

This new category was created in order to provide a membership option for those who wish to declare their timeless support of the Guild by making a commitment to Guild membership for life. Lifetime Membership is available for \$3,000, either as a lump sum or payable over six years. "Lifetime members never have to write a check for AGO membership renewal again," declared Herbert Buffington, director of the AGO's Committee on Membership Development and Chapter Support. "AGO National Headquarters will credit the chapter portion of the Lifetime member's dues to the local chapter of the member's choice on an annual basis." Lifetime members designate the corpus of their Lifetime Membership dues for one of the following funds at the end of their life: the AGO Endowment Fund, New Organist Fund, Nita Akin Fund, or National Council-Designated Fund, which supports general operations.

Eleven individuals became Lifetime Members during the pilot program in 2009; many more are expected to enroll as Lifetime Members during the 2010–2011 membership renewal campaign. Lifetime Members are listed on the AGO Web site, <u>www.agohq.org</u>, and honored in THE AMERICAN ORGANIST Magazine annually.

Ebenezer Chapel Organ Completed

After a painstaking building restoration and the installation of the organ from the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, all the pieces have finally come together for a splendid tonally finished instrument worth celebrating.

Background:

The historic chapel on the campus of Ebenezer Lutheran Church is the first Lutheran church in Columbia, organized in 1830. After being burned and completely destroyed during the Civil War, the building was rebuilt, literally on the ashes of the old church, in 1870. In 1930, the present day neogothic church was completed and the older building, now called the chapel, was used for Sunday School and community events. Eventually falling into disrepair, the chapel was meticulously restored in 1993 and has become a vital part of Ebenezer's life.

Details:

The chapel organ core is an M.P. Moller, opus 8079, from the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. The present installation was done in 2004 by James Freeman whose firm handled the design and installation, including the construction of a new wind chest and frame, refurbishing the offsets and installing new swell shades. Case construction was performed by Norman Shealy. The principal and gedeckt are Moller. The oboe is M.P. Moller rebuilt by Broome and Company in Hartford, Conn. The gamba is from a 1948 Pels, replacing the Moller viola which was badly damaged during storage, but is of similar scale to the viola. The celeste, provided by William B. Clarke, is Reiger. A new Laukaff blower powers the organ and the switching/combination action and swell engine are Peterson.

Conclusion:

This past April, the final piece of the restoration was completed with masterful tonal finishing performed by James Freeman and Chaz Dewsbury. In one of the best acoustical environments around, the organ now sounds fantastic. The organ community is invited to come play the organ. Simply call Tom White to arrange this at (803) 765-9430.

Arrangements are being made for recitals this autumn.

About the technicians:

James Freeman began his organ building career in 1983, working part time under James E. Garvin and Brian M. Stout of Jacksonville, FL. In 2001, Mr. Freeman founded Freeman's General Services, Inc., providing pipe organ service in northeast Florida, Georgia, South Carolina and Alabama.

Moller (2m 10r); Lord of Life Lutheran, St. Simon's, GA, (2m 4r with Rodgers console). **Charles "Chaz" Dewsbury** is a freelance pipe organ designer/builder with over 30 years of experience in the business. Mentored by the late Allan Van Zoeren, he served as pipe shop manager for Van Zoeren

Organbuilders, Inc. and Rodgers Instrument Corporation, supervising the building and installation of several hundred pipe installations across the continental U.S., Hawaii, Japan, Korea, South America and the Caribbean. Dewsbury is one of a small number of artisans working in the U.S. today trained in the old-school tradition of organ building while utilizing the new technologies available to the art. Dewsbury calls St. Augustine, Florida, home, but spends much of his time traveling across the country and beyond, continuing to build his impressive portfolio.


Chaz was recently named curator of the 90 rank Aeolian Skinner organ at the historic (Flagler) Memorial Presbyterian Church in St. Augustine. Other notable organs he maintains are the 56 rank Casavant at the Cathedral-Basilica of St. Augustine and the 97 rank Quimby/Casavant at Jacoby Symphony Hall, home of the Jacksonville Symphony.

Columbia Baroque Soloists

Columbia Baroque Soloists recorder performer, Jean Hein will lead the second annual Summer Recorder Institute entitled "The Baroque Recorder in London: Handel, Purcell, Sammartini and Friends." The Recorder Institute will be a four-week study of Baroque music written by musicians who lived and worked in London. Because London was a cosmopolitan city and a fascinating hub of cultural activity these composers were English, Italian, German, French, Dutch or other nationalities. Classes will feature group and individual recorder playing and include a study of Italian-style free ornamentation in which the performer joins the composer in a creative partnership role. Our guest artist for one session will be Dr. Jerry Curry, harpsichordist, who will perform and discuss the role of the harpsichord in Baroque chamber music. The Recorder Seminar is designed for people already playing the alto recorder at advanced beginner, intermediate or advanced levels. Soprano recorder players are welcome, but the repertoire emphasis will be on the alto recorder.

Classes will be held on four Tuesdays July 13, 20, 27 and August 3 from 6:30 - 8:00 p.m. at Shandon United Methodist Church, 3407 Devine St. in Columbia. Tuition for this class is \$80 and preregistration is required. Class size will be kept small for plenty of individual attention.
