A recap of 2016-2017 programs demonstrates great diversity and appeal.

In September, AGO welcomed three new organists to Columbia. Andrew Kotylo, Thomas Russell, and Brent te Velde performed for us at First Presbyterian and St. Peter's Catholic Church. "Chef Rich" at First Presbyterian provided a delightful catered dinner. In October, AGO member Matthew Whitehouse performed an outstanding recital at St. John's Episcopal Church on the rebuilt pipe organ with its new console. In November, Katherine Johnson, 2016 winner of the Young Organist Competition, performed a tremendous recital at Trinity Cathedral with a reception hosted by AGO.

The final program of the year was a delightful presentation of the silent movie "Safety Last" with organ improvisation by Ron Carter.

All programs this year were well-attended by members and guests. This year AGO was able to reach more of the general public and educate them on our goals and garner their support for our mission.


