Young Organist Competition Alumni Make Us Proud!

Those of you who are avid readers of *The American Organist* read about the results of the Albert Schweitzer Organ Festival and Competition held in September of 2023 (page 19 in TAO May issue). It should make us proud that three of the participants were previous winners of the Young Organist Competition sponsored by our Columbia AGO Chapter.

First place winner was Daniel Colaner (YOC winner in 2022) who took home the handsome prize of \$7500. Henry Dangerfield (YOC winner in 2024) was awarded third prize (\$1500) and the David C. Spicer Hymn Playing Award and the Audience Prize.

The opening recital was performed by Bruce Xu, winner of the ASOFH first prize and audience prize in the Young Professional Competition in September 2022. Bruce was the YOC winner in 2017.

Additionally, in a recent e-mail, Daniel Colaner announced that he has been invited to join the incoming freshman class at Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia and he will be assuming an Organ Scholar position at Church of the Redeemer (Episcopal) in Bryn Mawr, PA.

In virtually every issue of *The American Organist*, our YOC winners continue to garner prizes for their outstanding accomplishments in organ performance. Congratulations to the three alumni!


