Young Organist in Concert Friday, March 6, 2020 at 7 p.m. Trinity Episcopal Cathedral 1100 Sumter Street Columbia SC 29201



We welcome back to Columbia the winner of the first Young Organist Competition which was held in 2011. At the time, Jacob was just a tenth grader who performed Trio Sonata No. 1 by J.S. Bach and *Joie et Clarté* from *Les Corps Glorieux* by Olivier Messiaen. An ambitious program by any standard!

Jacob Reed was born in Oxford, England and then grew up in North Carolina where he began his organ studies with Dr. Wylie "Van" Quinn. After high school, Jacob matriculated at Yale University where he was the first student to receive a simultaneous BA/MA in music history and theory (double-major in mathematics). There he studied organ with Thomas Murray and harpsichord with Arthur Haas. In 2019, Jacob graduated with an MM in organ performance from Yale's School of Music/Institute of Sacred Music, where he studied with Martin Jean while serving as Organ Scholar at Grace Church in New York City. He

was the recipient of the ISM's 2018 Robert Baker Scholarship, and the YSM's 2019 Julia R. Sherman Memorial Prize for excellence in organ playing.

In addition to organ recitals across the U.S., Europe, and Canada, Jacob has performed widely on other keyboards and instruments. He was artist-in-residence as organist and pianist at the 2016 and 2017 Uncommon Music Festivals in Sitka, Alaska. He was piano accompanist for the Yale Opera Program, he played in the Yale Temperament Viol Consort and Yale Collegium Musicum, and he served as harpsichordist for the Yale Baroque Opera Project. Jacob is currently a PhD student in Music History and Theory at the University of Chicago, where he is a Neubauer Family Distinguished Doctoral Fellow and an Organ Scholar at Rockefeller Chapel.

You will not want to miss a stellar concert by the winner of the first Young Organist Competition. Jacob has already found a niche in the world of concert organists and music scholars. AGO chapter members can be proud of helping to launch the career of this young artist.

Catawba College - Salisbury, North Carolina

Catawba College is a small, faith-based (UCC), liberal arts college located about 45 miles north of Charlotte in the quaint town of Salisbury, NC. The 1000-seat Omwake-Dearborn Chapel, named for two former college presidents, is now 55 years old. At the time of the dedication, an electronic organ was in place but was later replaced by a 42 rank 3 manual Casavant pipe organ. Over the years, the pipe organ fell into disrepair and its baroque tonality fell out of favor. Several attempts were made to either repair the Casavant or replace it. Al Murrell, Vice President of R. A. Daffer Church Organs, Inc., built a strong relationship with Professor Paul Oakley and his successor Dr. Phillip Burgess by providing Rodgers Organs for their annual service of lessons and carols. Because of the relationship Al built over the years with college personnel, R.A.Daffer Church Organs, Inc was chosen to build and install the new four manual 84 stop Rodgers Organ. In addition, 17 ranks of the existing Casavant Organ were incorporated into the new instrument. The project which includes new wind chests will be completed in April of 2019. We wish to thank Dr. Phillip Burgess, Associate Chair of Music and

Mr. Bill Graham, Chair of Trustees for putting their trust in our company for this project. The new instrument will enrich the weddings and services that are held in this exquisite chapel for many year
