In March of 2014, **Alden Wright**, an organ prodigy from Salisbury, North Carolina, took the first place award in the Young Organist Competition sponsored by the Greater Columbia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Now in its fifth year, the competition draws outstanding young organists from South Carolina and surrounding states. The first prize is a check for \$1000 which is meant to help the student continue his organ studies. Alden studies with **Dr. Phillip Burgess** of Catawba College in Salisbury and is also the recipient of the Stigall Scholarship sponsored by the Charlotte AGO Chapter. Returning

to Columbia to present a recital, Alden, now 16 years old, will perform a challenging program of some of the great organ works by Langlais, Dupré, Alain, Duruflé, Schroeder and Bolcom. The recital will take place on Saturday, November 8, 2014 at 2:00 p.m. at Shandon United Methodist Church located at 3407 Devine Street in Columbia. The program is free and open to the public. Kenneth Miller, a native of Conover, North Carolina, is Associate Organist and Choirmaster at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Columbia and Instructor of Organ at the University of South Carolina. He is a doctoral candidate in the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music as an organ student of Martin Jean and Thomas Murray and holds degrees from Yale and Lenoir-Rhyne University, where he studied with Florence Jowers. He is the winner of the American Guild of Organists/Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists in New England (2011), the Jacqueline Englert-Marchal Prize for Interpretation of French Music from the jury in Biarritz, France (2011), and the Schoenstein Competition in the Art of Organ Accompaniment (2012). At Yale, he received the Charles Ives Prize



for his musicianship and the Aidan Kavanagh Prize for his academic research, which deals with the development of open score notation in seventeenth-century Germany; additionally, he was active as a choral accompanist and continuo player, playing organ and harpsichord for the Yale Schola Cantorum and other choirs under the batons of David Hill, Simon Carrington, Christopher Robinson, and Helmuth Rilling. Before moving to Columbia, he served as the Yale Institute of Sacred Music Intern at the Cathedral of St. Philip, Atlanta.

PAUL SPICER IN RESIDENCE AT TRINITY CATHEDRAL

Paul Spicer, imminent British conductor, composer, and scholar, will conclude a week's residency at Trinity Cathedral by conducting all services on November 2, including the 4:00 p.m. All Souls' Requiem. Perhaps best known for his many recordings as conductor of the Finzi Singers, Mr. Spicer teaches conducting at Birmingham Conservatoire, as well as Oxford and Durham Universities. He began his career as a chorister at New College, Oxford, and was later a pupil of Herbert Howells. He published a biography of Howells in 1998; his biography of George Dyson was published this past May. In addition to conducting rehearsals with the Cathedral Choirs, Mr. Spicer will lead classes and rehearsals at the USC School of Music.

I am writing on behalf of the 2015 Tallahassee Sacred Music Conference (Dr. Iain Quinn, Director) which will be held at St. John's Episcopal Church, Tallahassee, Florida, January 22-24, 2015. The conference committee would like to extend a warm welcome to you and the members of your chapter to attend this biennial event. The Conference brings musicians, clergy, and congregants together from across the United States for seminars, discussion forums, and masterclasses devoted to church music.

Tallahassee's local AGO chapter is co-sponsoring the Conference in addition to The Florida State University College of Music, Church Music Institute (CMI), Florida ACDA, and several regional churches.

This year our keynote speaker will be Don E. Saliers, Wm. R. Cannon Professor of Theology and Worship, Emeritus, at Emory University and adjunct professor at St. John's University School of Theology. As you know he is also the current AGO Chaplain. The guest organist is Pamela Ruiter-Feenstra, a noted exponent of the art of improvisation and performance practice. Workshops will cover a variety of topics including community building and outreach through choirs, an anthem reading session, organ improvisation, service playing skills, using the piano in worship, and the hymnody of the Moravian church. There will also be services of Choral Evensong and Compline sung by choirs of St. John's Episcopal Church and concerts featuring Dr. Ruiter-Feenstra, The Florida State University early music ensembles, plus a hymn festival.

The Rodgers 589 is serving the congregation beautifully, with technology that is continually updateable for the future worship needs of the congregation.

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

In addition, Katherine Meloan is a classical dancer and the artistic director/dancer of Bridal Ballet. Dr. Meloan is on faculty at the Manhattan School of Music and is the chapel organist and director of the Mariner's Chorus and the Mariner Chapel Choir at the United States Merchant Marine Academy—one of the five federally funded service academies.

Her recording was called by host Michael Barone on the radio show *Pipedreams* "an auspicious performance." Organist Katherine Meloan is an artist whose expressive gifts and virtuosity, various interests, and eclectic repertoire enable her to contribute to the classical world with fresh and distinctive performances. Katherine's performances include: Saint Mary the Virgin (New York City), a performance that was subsequently featured on American Public Radio's *Pipedreams*, Florida International University—Wertheim Concert Hall (Miami, Florida), Spoleto Festival (Charleston, South Carolina), and in Europe on the historical organs of Clicquot (Poitiers, France) and Cavaillé-Coll (Epernay, France)...
