THE CARILLON: UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL A ZOOM WEBINAR presented by Laura Ellis, Carillonneur Saturday, November 14, 2020 10:00 a.m. to Noon (Join 9:45-10:00)

University of Florida's Century Tower

Church musicians are well acquainted with handbells, but what about these terms: chime, swinging bells, peal, tolling, traditional

vs. a non-traditional carillon? What type of bells are associated with Quasimodo and Notre-

Dame? What do carillonneurs actually do up in the tower? We'll uncover these mysteries and

more. The first session will be in the University of Florida's carillon practice studio, where Laura Ellis will explain how a traditional carillon differs from other types of bells, discuss why many people think the carillon is out of tune, and illustrate basic carillon technique. Attendees will take a break as Laura climbs eleven flights of stairs to reach the playing chamber in UF's Century Tower. Once there, we'll have a live demo and listen to the performance of a couple of pieces. You won't want to miss it!

Laura Ellis is Associate School Director and Professor in the School of Music at the University of Florida where she teaches carillon, organ, and courses in sacred music. A graduate of Luther College in Decorah, IA, she holds the MM degree in church music and the DMA in organ performance from the University of Kansas. Her major organ teachers have been James Higdon and William Kuhlman. While in residence at the University of Kansas, she studied carillon with Albert Gerken. Ellis has performed as organist and carillonneur throughout the United States, as well as in the Netherlands, Canada, and Australia. Recordings of her organ performances have been featured on *Pipe Dreams*. Active in the American Guild of Organists, Ellis served three terms as Regional Councillor for the Southeast. She

currently serves as director of the Music and Publications Committee for the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA) and was recently elected to GCNA's Board of Directors.

- Zoom meetings can also be accessed via a smart phone or pad, and you can be seen and heard. Download the free Zoom app beforehand.
- You can attach a clip-on webcam with microphone to the monitor if it doesn't have these. (\$20 to \$50 at Walmart, Target, Best Buy, etc.) It plugs into the USB port. Open the camera in your "programs" and minimize it <u>before</u> joining the Zoom.
