The recital is open to the public and will be followed by a reception.



New Pipe Organ Projects in Columbia

On Tuesday, October 7, at St. Joseph Catholic Church, we learned about two new pipe organs coming to the Columbia area. AGO members serving in these churches provided information about the selection process, the organ builders, specifications of the instruments, as well as structural changes being made within the worship spaces. First Presbyterian Church will install a 4 Manual, 69 Rank instrument built by Parsons Pipe Organ Builders, Op. 58. The presenter was Thomas Russell, Organist/ Assistant Director of Music. St. Joseph Catholic Church will install a 3 Manual, 50 Rank instrument by the Italian organ builder Mascioni. Information was given by Worth Lewallen, Music Director, and Patrick Hawkins, Organist. We look adding these forward to two fine instruments to Columbia's pipe organ registry.

Scott Scheetz




Scott Scheetz began playing piano at age three and realized soon after that music was his greatest passion in life. In middle school, he started organ lessons, was highly involved in his church's music program, and gained recognition in his hometown of Aiken, S.C., as a lounge pianist specializing in the music of Billy Joel. In 2010, he won the East Carolina University Pre-College Organ Competition for the Southeastern Region of the United States. In 2011, he won Second Place in the Young Organist Competition in Columbia S.C.

Scott completed his Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance at the Jacobs School of Music, Indiana University, where he studied with Dr. Christopher Young. He completed his Master of Sacred Music with a focus in Organ Performance at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, where he studied with Professor Stefan Engels.

Scott served as Associate Director of Music and Organist at Christ United Methodist Church in Plano, Texas. In August 2025, he accepted the position of Interim Organist and Choirmaster in Knoxville, TN, at First Presbyterian Church.

Scott met his wife Katie Minion at Indiana University while they were both studying organ performance, and they were married in 2018. She is presently the organist and Associate Director of Music at Church Street United Methodist Church in downtown Knoxville. They enjoy performing duo recitals



We're pleased to welcome Chase Loomer in concert as a part of our 2025-26 organ concert series at St. Martin's-in-the-Fields. Admission is free of charge.

Chase Loomer is an award-winning organist who has given solo recitals throughout North America, in venues including Trinity Church, Boston; Holy Trinity Cathedral, Kingston, Jamaica; St. Joseph Cathedral, Columbus, OH; Coral Ridge Presbyterian, Ft. Lauderdale; Church of the Covenant, Cleveland; All Saints' Episcopal Church, Atlanta; and Trinity Cathedral, Portland, OR. In 2025, he was part of The Diapason magazine's class of "20 Under 30," and also featured as a "NextGen" artist in the June 2022 edition of The American Organist magazine. Chase has performed as a soloist and continuo player with numerous ensembles, including the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, Atlanta Symphony Brass, Yale Philharmonia, Atlanta Baroque Orchestra, Indianapolis Baroque Orchestra, and Tonos del Sur.

Mr. Loomer was the first prize winner of the 2018 Taylor Organ Competition and the 2015 AGO / Quimby Southeast Regional Competition, and he has been a semifinalist in the National Competition in Organ Improvisation and the Longwood Gardens International Organ Competition. In 2025, he was one of six organists selected worldwide to compete in the St. Albans International Improvisation Competition.

He holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music (B.M), Yale University (M.M), and is a doctoral degree candidate at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. While at Yale, he received the Robert Baker Scholarship from the ISM and the Julia R. Sherman Memorial Prize from the School of Music, both awarded for excellence in organ performance. His teachers have included David Higgs, Martin Jean, Christopher Young, Edoardo Bellotti, Jeffrey Brillhart, Jeffrey Smith, and Patrick Scott. In addition to his work as an organist, Chase is a jazz pianist and composer of choral, keyboard, and jazz music.


