FREEING THE CAGED BIRD

A VIRTUAL WORKSHOP FOR ORGANISTS presented by Barbara Lister-Sink, Ed.D. Saturday, October 3, 2020 10:00 a.m. to Noon



Keyboardists of all ages and levels are often frustrated and even tragically hindered by pain and injury related to playing. Dr. Barbara Lister-Sink, author of the MTNA-award-winning DVD Freeing the Caged Bird — Developing Well-Coordinated, Injury-Preventive Piano Technique, will offer an accessible but scientifically informed look into injury-preventive techniques for organists and pianists. She will demonstrate basic biomechanical principles for "basic form," define how the body is designed to work best with the instrument, discuss risk factors for injury, and offer practical tools for achieving good coordination and freedom. Principals of the Alexander Technique will be included.

Barbara Lister-Sink, internationally acclaimed pianist and acknowledged global leader in injury-preventive keyboard technique, is a graduate of Smith College, the Utrecht Conservatory, and holds an Ed.D. from Columbia University. A Steinway Artist since 1977, Lister-Sink has performed and given workshops throughout North America, Europe and Australia. Her DVD Freeing the Caged Bird — Developing Well-Coordinated, Injury-Preventive Piano Technique won the 2002 MTNA-Frances Clark Keyboard Pedagogy Award. Presently Director of the Salem College School of Music Graduate Music Program, including the unique Master of Music (organ and piano) with an Emphasis in Injury-Preventive Technique, she has taught on the Eastman School of Music Artist Faculty and was keyboardist for Amsterdam's Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra. Lister-Sink was chosen by Musical America Global as one of America's "30 Top Professionals of 2018" as an innovator, independent thinker, and visionary leader.

Suggestions for Accessing Zoom Meetings

- A Zoom account is not required to access a meeting. Click on the link that will be e-mailed to you. You should not require a password, if you enter this way.
- For computers without a built-in camera and microphone, you can see and hear the presentation, but you can't be seen or heard. You can use the "chat" feature.
- If you are having problems with sound or camera, check your computer settings to make sure nothing is blocked.
- Zoom meetings can be accessed via a smart phone or pad, and you can be seen and heard. Download the free Zoom app beforehand.
- You can attach a clip-on webcam with microphone to the monitor if it doesn't have these. (\$20 to \$50 at Walmart, Target, Best Buy, etc.) It plugs into the USB port. Open the camera in your "programs" and minimize it <u>before</u> joining the Zoom.


