William Douglas is the Acting Director of Music and Organist at Trinity Cathedral in Columbia, South Carolina. He previously served as Associate Choir Master and Organist at Trinity. He is a graduate of the University of South Carolina where he earned a B.Mus. and M.M. in Organ Performance as a pupil of Dr. Jared Johnson. He also studied continuo and harpsichord with Dr. Jerry Curry. Mr. Douglas was a recipient of the Summerall Award from USC. Prior to joining the staff at Trinity Cathedral, he served as the Lloyd Cast Organ Fellow at Cathedral of All Saints – Albany, NY. There he fulfilled the role of sub-organist of the Cathedral and assisted in the weekly education and running of the historic Cathedral Choir of Men and Boys.

Update on YOC Alumni



Nicholas Stigall, winner of the 2018 Young Organist Competition, graduated from Indiana University in May 2023 with highest distinction. He studied with Janette Fishell during his four-year undergraduate study. This summer he completed the AAGO exam. Presently he is Organ Scholar at Trinity Cathedral in Portland, Oregon. Following this gap year, he will start his Master of Music degree at Yale Institute of Sacred Music.

AGO member Jim Johnson wrote about Nicholas: "Nicholas has been the organ scholar at Chautauqua the last two summers. He assisted Organist/Music Director Joshua Stafford with service playing and he accompanied the choir for 65 services and over 90 rehearsals in the 9week summer season. He has grown tremendously in his playing and musicianship. He was the organ scholar at Chautauqua for the last two summers. We all love Nicholas!"

In recent correspondence with Nicholas, he said, "I remember the Columbia competition dearly and I am so happy to hear that it is still alive and strong! If I recall

correctly, the November winner's recital may have been my first solo concert. The whole experience certainly helped boost my organ career at a critical time in my musical development and I will always be grateful for that!"
