The Greater Columbia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists opens their 2012-13 Season at Saint Peter's Catholic Church, celebrating the Tenth Anniversary of their three-manual 36-rank Peragallo pipe organ. Organist Mark Husey performs with students from the USC School of Music, followed by a festive reception.

FREE ADMISSION for GCAGO members

In the fall of 2002, Peragallo Opus 643 was installed in Saint Peter's Catholic Church, and was dedicated March 23, 2003 by Bishop David Thompson, retired bishop of Charleston, assisted by Monsignor Leigh Lehocky, *Pastor*, with featured organist Father Francis Kline, abbot of Mepkin Abbey (now deceased).

This instrument is the third pipe organ in the 1906 Gothic edifice designed by Frank Milburn, which stood on the same site as a church designed by Robert Mills from 1824. Previous instruments included a 10 ½ rank Kilgen (preserved from the first church), and a 1984 two-manual 26 rank Wicks. The Peragallo organ was part of a restoration effort completed in 2002 that included the installation of a wooden floor, which combined with the high vaulted ceiling, gives nearly 4 seconds of reverberation when the church is empty.

In the course of a calendar year, the Peragallo organ at Saint Peter's will lead the congregation's singing at some 250 weekend, holy day, ecumenical, diocesan and parochial school liturgies, in addition to weddings, funerals, and concerts. Since his appointment to Saint Peter's in January 2006 as Director of Music and Liturgy, Mark Husey has served as this Chapter's Sub Dean and now serves as District Convener for South Carolina AGO Chapters and Program Chair for the 2013 AGO Region IV Convention. Over 1,310,000 views have been tallied from 554 videos posted on YouTube.com/VisitStPeters and YouTube.com/MarkHusey, featuring the organ in liturgies and concerts. Saint Peter's will host the Opening Convocation of the 2013 AGO Region IV Convention as well as the closing concert and luncheon. Join the Greater Columbia AGO at 7PM Saturday, September 8, in celebrating this significant cultural milestone in our region, and bring friends!

GERRE HANCOCK (February 21, 1934 - 21 January 21, 2012)

A legend in the organ world, Gerre Hancock was an organist, composer and a master of the art of improvisation. At the time of his death, he was a Professor of Organ and Sacred Music at the University of Texas. From 1971 to 2004 he was Organist and Master of the Choristers at Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue. He had also served on the faculty at The Juilliard School in New York City, taught improvisation at the Institute of Sacred Music, Yale University and taught at The Eastman School of Music. His textbook *Improvising: How to Master the Art* is studied by organists throughout the world.

A memorial Choral Requiem Eucharist for him was celebrated on February 4th, 2012 at Saint Thomas. Dr. Hancock's ashes were interred beneath the floor of the chancel where he stood to conduct the choir for 33 years.

In January of 2012, the first request for donations to the 2013 Regional Convention was issued. During these eight months, we have collected from 32 South Carolina donors and 3 out-of-state donors. Of the South Carolina donors, 9 were non-members! The total amount of gifts at this time is **\$9856**. This is a wonderful start but the fact is that we need a total of \$16,600 from gifts and grants. Simple math says that we need **\$6744** to reach our goal.

This is a regional convention which will bring organists from 7 states to Columbia to hear artists like Dongho Lee, Janette Fishell, Ray and Elizabeth Chenault - duo-organists, Charles Tompkins and Stefan Engels. New compositions will be premiered by the artists on their recitals. Columbia's own Dr. Bill Bates is writing a work for Dongho Lee. The prestigious Quimby Organ Competition (the Olympics of the organ world) will be held during the convention. In addition, there will be workshops on a myriad of topics for organists, handbell players, and choral directors. And you get to be involved with all of these events! Surely you want to have a part in making this exciting event happen.

For those who have already given, I thank you for your support. To those who plan to give, please keep in mind that bills are arriving now and they need to be paid right away. Columbia AGO has approximately 120 members and only 24 have given for the convention. If each remaining member gave \$ 70.25, we would reach our goal!

The Regional Convention program booklet will be dedicated to Dr. Sally Cherrington-Beggs who died on March 17, 2012. Sally presented programs for Columbia AGO and for the POE which was held in Columbia in June, 2010 and her students performed on master classes and recitals. Donations in Sally's memory are a fitting way to honor this outstanding organist, teacher, and scholar. You may designate your donation for Sally in the "memo" blank on your check.

I am happy to announce "Bach Festival Days at Lenoir-Rhyne University, October 7-10, 2012."

The Sacred Music Program of Lenoir-Rhyne University presents this event to highlight the life and work of Johann Sebastian Bach. Our Church Musicians-in-Residence and Bach experts this year are **Dr. Russell Stinson** from Lyon College in Batesville, Arkansas, and the **Reverend Michael Costello**, Director of the Bach Vesper Series and Cantor of Grace Lutheran Church and School, River Forest, Illinois, and an alumnus of Lenoir-Rhyne. Dr. Stinson is a widely published Bach scholar. Oxford University Press will soon release his latest book, *J. S. Bach at His Royal Instrument: Essays on His Organ Works*. Pastor Costello recently led the Grace Choir in a Bach cantata with orchestra during worship at St. Thomas Church, Leipzig, where Bach served as Cantor. Both presenters will share their expertise on Bach in lectures, discussions, lessons, rehearsals, and worship performance. All events will be held in the Mauney Music Building on the university campus and are **free** and open to the public.
