Director of Music at Forest Lake Presbyterian Church. A Columbia native, she has also been a voice teacher, an adjudicator, and a clinician. She has sung with Colla Voce, and has been a singer and soloist for Sandlapper Singers and the Columbia Choral Society.

Organ Works Inspired by the Stars

Come hear organist and astronomy educator **Matthew Whitehouse** present a program of organ works inspired by the stars! This concert experience includes both historical and modern works accompanied by projected astronomical images. We'll explore the ancient Greeks' notion of the Music of the Spheres, discover a piece by the "Father of Modern Astronomy" William Herschel, and hear some of Matthew's own compositions and improvisations. We hope to see you there!

Organist, composer, and astronomy educator **Matthew Whitehouse** has appeared in recitals throughout the United States and internationally, and his compositions have been performed in major European venues such as Notre Dame Cathedral and St. Sulpice in Paris. One of his major creative interests is engaging audiences in exploring connections between music and astronomy, an interest frequently reflected in his work as a composer and performer. Recent engagements include St. Paul's Cathedral in Melbourne, Australia.

Dr. Whitehouse currently serves as Observatory Manager at the South Carolina State Museum in Columbia. He is engaged internationally as a speaker on music/astronomy connections, and has given presentations at conferences of the American Astronomical Society, Astronomical Society of the Pacific, and International Astronomical Union. He has appeared twice as a presenter for the interdisciplinary *Conference on the Inspiration of Astronomical Phenomena* (INSAP): INSAP VII (2010) in Bath, UK, and INSAP VIII (2013) at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City.

In addition to his responsibilities at the South Carolina State Museum, Dr. Whitehouse serves as Director of Music at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Lexington, South Carolina. He completed undergraduate studies in organ performance at The University of South Carolina and holds the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The University of Arizona as a student of Pamela Decker.
