Catawba College - Salisbury, North Carolina

Catawba College is a small, faith-based (UCC), liberal arts college located about 45 miles north of Charlotte in the quaint town of Salisbury, NC. The 1000-seat Omwake-Dearborn Chapel, named for two former college presidents, is now 55 years old. At the time of the dedication, an electronic organ was in place but was later replaced by a 42 rank 3 manual Casavant pipe organ. Over the years, the pipe organ fell into disrepair and its baroque tonality fell out of favor. Several attempts were made to either repair the Casavant or replace it. Al Murrell, Vice President of R. A. Daffer Church Organs, Inc., built a strong relationship with Professor Paul Oakley and his successor Dr. Phillip Burgess by providing Rodgers Organs for their annual service of lessons and carols. Because of the relationship Al built over the years with college personnel, R.A.Daffer Church Organs, Inc was chosen to build and install the new four manual 84 stop Rodgers Organ. In addition, 17 ranks of the existing Casavant Organ were incorporated into the new instrument. The project which includes new wind chests will be completed in April of 2019. We wish to thank Dr. Phillip Burgess, Associate Chair of Music and

Mr. Bill Graham, Chair of Trustees for putting their trust in our company for this project. The new instrument will enrich the weddings and services that are held in this exquisite chapel for many year

~ **Jared Johnson** on the death of his mother, Sara Rardin Johnson, on Sunday, June 9.

Sara R. Johnson died June 9, 2019 at Richland Hospital in Columbia, South Carolina. She was 75.

Sara was born June 2, 1944 in Marysville, Ohio. Christened Sara Austin Rardin she was the daughter of Jared J. Rardin and Ruth Elizabeth Ferguson ("REF") Rardin. She was the step-daughter of Beverly D. Horr. Sara attended Portsmouth High School, class of 1962, where she initiated an interest in the visual arts, which would become a motivating passion of her life. She graduated cum laude from Ohio Wesleyan University in 1966.

At OWU she was president of Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority.

Sara married C. Clayton Johnson August 6, 1966. She supported her husband's education first as a secretary at the Mental Health Clinic of the University of Virginia, then by teaching junior high school English at Dundee, Michigan.

Returning to Portsmouth, Ohio in 1970, Sara founded a volunteer program to teach art in the public schools, and in 1976 was instrumental in the founding of the Southern Ohio Museum. She became the Museum's first curator of education, and went on to serve as its Co-Director or Director for twenty-five years. She directed the Museum's acquisition of its three main permanent collections; the Ackerman collection of historical photographs, the Wertz collection of Native American artifacts, and the master works of Portsmouth native, Clarence Carter, now displayed in the "Sara Johnson Gallery" which was named in her honor on the occasion of her retirement.

In 1980 Sara was chosen to be an official representative of the City of Portsmouth and successfully presented the city's case in winning designation as an "All American City" in competition at Detroit.

She is survived by her husband, Clay, her daughter, Sara Elizabeth Johnson and her husband Brock Shorno, both of Los Angeles, a son Jared Clayton Johnson and his wife, Erin Latting Spelman Johnson, both of Columbia, South Carolina, and two grandsons, Samuel Latting Johnson and Clayton Charles Spelman Johnson.

A memorial service for Larry Lamberth Howard, 82, will be held at 3:00 p.m. Sunday, June 23, 2019 at Christus Victor Lutheran Church. The family will receive friends from 2:00 until 3:00 p.m. prior to the service at the church.

Mr. Howard died Saturday, June 15, 2019. Born in Burlington, NC, he was a son of the late Archie Lamberth Howard and Nan Wilhelm Howard.

After graduating from Greenville High School in 1955, Mr. Howard enlisted in the United States Navy, serving on Active Duty from 1955 to 1957. He continued his service in the Navy Reserve for several more years. He played baseball during his service on the Norfolk Naval Base team, The Flyers. He was also stationed on the USS Forrestal. After graduating from Furman University, Mr. Howard spent his entire working career with the Internal Revenue Service. He retired after 30 years of service.

Mr. Howard had a deep love for music. He was a skilled musician, playing clarinet and saxophone. He played in the Greenville High School band and in jazz bands throughout high school and college. He also played the banjo, guitar, bass guitar and baritone ukulele. There was always music in the home. He handed down his love of music and musical talent to his children and grandchildren.

Mr. Howard also loved nature and traveling. He and his wife traveled extensively after his retirement, visiting all 50 states, all Canadian provinces and most of the countries of Central America. Their travels included his favorite place, Alaska, to which they drove on three different occasions.

Most of all, Mr. Howard loved his family and spending time with his beloved grandchildren, to whom he was affectionately known as Gan Gan. Mr. Howard was a member of Christus Victor Lutheran Church.

Surviving are his wife of 57 years, Zora Howard; daughter, Laura H. Sturgeon (Billy) of Chapin, SC; son, Chris Howard (Diana) of Columbia, SC; grandchildren, Eric Sturgeon, Rachel Kaiser, Amanda Kaiser, Maddie Howard, and Jesse Kaiser; brother, Don Howard (Connie) of Simpsonville, SC; and nephews, Matthew Howard and Stephen Howard.
