



Tina Milhorn Stallard, soprano, and Lynn Kompass, piano, perform four works that present the sacred and secular from the female perspective. Henry Purcell's *The Blessed Virgin's Expostulation* is an extraordinary example of Purcell's genius for setting words and capturing changing emotions. The work captures Mary's sense of desperation and anxiety when the 12 year-old-boy Jesus goes missing. Schumann's *Gedichte der Königen Maria Stuart*, a cycle of 5 songs, sets texts attributed to the tragic Queen of Scots. Prokofiev's *Five Poems of Anna Akhmatova*, one of Russia's finest poets, employs warm lyricism to portray the refined and sometimes morbid feelings of a society woman. John Fitz Rogers composed the song cycle, *Songs of Time and Tide*, five poems from the collection "Gitanjali" by Rabindranath Tagore, revolving around children and motherhood.


