

On Saturday, January 10, 2009, the Greater Columbia AGO Chapter hosted a "Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza" program to interest piano students in organ. The well coordinated event was cochaired by Tony Roof, Dean; Dr. David Lowry, and Sharon Witherell. It was held at Washington Street United Methodist Church, Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, and at the Church of the Good Shepherd. There were over 50 in attendance, with around 30 of them students.





Dr. David Lowry, Winthrop University professor and organist at the Church of the Good Shepherd, was the clinician for the day. Performers during the day included Scott Scheets, a high school sophomore, and local chapter members Louis Shirer and Jennifer Zoellner.

After an informative introduction to the organ and organ music, each student had the opportunity to play a piece on the organs and to ask questions. Students then watched the video *Pulling Out all the Stops* while eating Pizza. When the day was complete, each was

given a basket of materials which included copies of *The American Organist* and *The Diapason* magazines, *A Young Person's Guide to the Pipe Organ*, the local chapter's newsletter, 3 organ CDs by local artist's Dr. Jared Johnson and Dr. David Lowry, and a POE brochure for Macon, GA.



Since 1988, Pipe Organ Encounters (POEs) have introduced more than 2,000 young people to the organ through instruction in organ playing, repertoire, history, design, and construction. These week-long summer institutes for students aged 13–18 provide private and group instruction, opportunities for ecumenical worship, and a chance for young musicians to meet others with similar interests. Basic keyboard proficiency is required, although previous organ study is not necessary. Local POE Committees may choose to grant special consideration on an individual basis for admission of a potential registrant whose age or training differs from the guidelines.


