JANUARY 19-20 ROCK HILL AND CHARLOTTE ITINERARY

FRIDAY EVENING

Suggested leaving time from Columbia is 6:00PM. Check in, eat about 7:30 and by 8:45 go to the Winthrop University campus to James F. Byrnes Auditorium where we have run of the hall for the night!

The organ is Æolian-Skinner Op. 1257, installed in 1955, finished and signed by G. Donald Harrison. This is *not* a rebuild of a previous organ—it is entirely Harrison's concept of an American Classic organ, without compromise. And it stands as one of the very last left in the USA. It will soon be removed for more than a year to be restored and for the auditorium to receive new electric lights, paint, and other adjustments. Everyone will have the opportunity to roam the hall, play the instrument.

David Lowry was hired as organ professor in 1965 when the organ was just 10 years old, and has been in charge of its safekeeping ever since. See a short history and specification at this web site.

SATURDAY

Leave Rock Hill shortly after 7:30AM for the short ride into Charlotte (a lot easier on Saturday than it is M-F!) to be in Covenant Presbyterian Church at 8:30 to inspect the rebuild of Æolian-Skinner Op. 1196, 1949, originally a G. Donald Harrison but considerably altered. The most recent work was done in 2004, with an improved acoustic in the church. In the Gallery is a 1975 two-manual mechanical action Schlicker, playable from its mechanical console or from the main organ. Travel a few short blocks to Christ Church Episcopal on Providence Road at 9:45AM leads us to a smaller space with a fine acoustic for the three manual Gabriel Kney Organ, 1980. Sorry, no web site specification available. A journey out to the Matthews/Pineville area gets us to Calvary Church with its 6,000 seats and the 14th largest organ in the world, one of the last by M. P. Möller. At 12:45 we depart for a quick lunch in the vicinity and back to uptown Charlotte area to visit the brand new Friendship Missionary Baptist Church at 2:00PM where Ruffatti has just installed their latest organ, with preparations for many more stops. Monty Bennett, principal organist of the church, will greet us and demonstrate the organ.
