

Spectacular concerts during Organists' Week June 30 - July 6, 2013

The Region IV Convention of the American Guild of Organists will be in held in Columbia, SC, the first week of July 2013. To celebrate this event, **the week has been declared "Organists' Week**" in South Carolina. World famous organ recitalists, including Stefan Engels, Janette Fishell, Christopher Houlihan, Dongho Lee, Charles Tompkins, and duo-organists Elizabeth and Raymond Chenault, will give performances at local area venues.

This is the first time the convention has been held in Columbia, SC. Sponsored by the Greater Columbia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, preparations have been ongoing for nearly three years for what will be a spectacular organ event in the city. Two hymns and six organ pieces have been composed for the event and will be premiered at different concerts during the convention. One of the hymns to be premiered was composed by local musician, Anne McNair, and one of the new organ compositions was composed by local musician and former organ professor at the University of South Carolina, Dr. William Bates. In addition to the recitals, there will be twenty-five workshop choices for convention participants to attend.

The opening concert performed by Stefan Engels will be held on Wednesday, July 3, at 8:00 p.m. at Washington Street United Methodist Church in Columbia. The following morning, Thursday, July 4, at 9:00 a.m., Dongho Lee will be in concert at the University of South Carolina School of Music Recital Hall. The day will be capped off with the performance of Elizabeth and Raymond Chenault playing organ duets at Shandon United Methodist Church, Columbia, at 8:00 p.m. Charles Tompkins will be in concert on Friday, July 5, at 9:00 a.m. at the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, Columbia. Finally, on Saturday, July 6, there will be a concert given by Janette Fishell at Saint Peter's Catholic Church, Columbia, at 1:00 p.m. and by Christopher Houlihan at James F. Byrnes Auditorium, Winthrop University, Rock Hill, SC, at 5:00 p.m.

Tickets for the concerts (for those not registered for the convention) will be available at the door. The cost is \$10, except for the Chenaults' performance, which is free to the public.
