Jared Johnson is Canon Organist and Choirmaster of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Columbia, South Carolina. As an organ recitalist he has appeared in major venues throughout North America, Great Britain, and Sweden, and Australia. His solo recordings on the Pro Organo and JAV labels have attracted critical praise and have been broadcast nationally on *Pipedreams*.



Mr. Johnson is a graduate of Oberlin College, where he earned a B.A. in English as well as a B.Mus. in Organ Performance under the tutelage of Haskell Thomson. He earned his M.M, M.M.A and D.M.A. degrees at Yale University as a pupil of Thomas Murray. In 1997, he was awarded a Watson Fellowship for a year's study of choral music and conducting in London. The Trinity Cathedral Choir under his direction has sung in residence at Washington National Cathedral; St. Thomas Church, New York; St. Philip's Cathedral, Atlanta; and Gloucester Cathedral, England. In 2009 they will be touring to Canterbury Cathedral and the American Cathedral in Paris.

In Columbia Mr. Johnson chairs the Artistic Committee of the South Carolina Philharmonic, and was co-chair of the South Carolina Mozart Festival in 2006. Prior to his appointment at Trinity Cathedral, Mr. Johnson served on the music staffs of Trinity Church in Boston; the Memorial Church at Harvard; Trinity Church on the Green in New Haven, CT; and the Berkeley Divinity School at Yale.

Tickets are \$10; \$8 for seniors; \$5 for students. Two guest artists will join the ensemble in an all G. F. Handel program commemorating the 250th anniversary of his death. Gail Ann Schroeder, our principal guest artist, will return in performances with the ensemble

and in a solo sonata for viola da gamba. Gail has been a favorite with our audiences. Her artistry, honed from 25 years of performing early music in Europe, inspires the ensemble to new musical heights. Joining the ensemble for the first time will be Susan Brashier Hicks performing on baroque oboe. Susan has degrees in oboe performance from the Oberlin College-Conservatory of Music and Yale University. She resides with her family in Vidalia, Georgia and performs with the Atlanta Baroque Orchestra. The Baroque Oboe is

a keyless instrument resembling a recorder, but played with a double reed similar to a modern oboe. This may be the first Columbia performance with a baroque oboe! The program of Handel's music will include a delightful trio sonata for oboe and recorder; a lovely German Aria for voice and oboe; and a sonata for harpsichord and one for recorder. The concert will end with a rarely performed cantata for solo voice from Handel's Italian period. Entitled "Tra

le fiamme," it tells the story of Daedalus and Icarus and is a fiery virtuosic piece for the entire ensemble.



Something To Celebrate

Mt. Pleasant Lutheran Church in Saluda, SC has something to celebrate. In February of 1996, fire destroyed the interior of their church, leaving only the outside walls standing. One of the things the fire took was their beloved Schlicker pipe organ. Using the insurance money, they rebuilt the interior and in 1999 a brand new mechanical action Schlicker organ was installed. Alas, this was the last Schlicker to be built as the company closed before actually finishing the installation and voicing.

In 2003, the firm of Greg Hand began the task of refurbishing and re-voicing the organ. Assisted by Ansel Price and the then interim organist, some much-needed repairs were completed including replacing the combination action and reworking the wind system. The final stage of the renovation was completed just before Easter of this year.

To celebrate the completion, a concert is planned for May 17 at 6:00pm consisting of Evening Prayer, choral selections featuring the organ, as well organ selections. The choir of St. Alban's Episcopal Church, Lexington, South Carolina will be the featured choir. St. Alban's choir is already becoming widely known for its choral music and special programs. Charles T. Owings, who serves St. Alban's as Director of Music and Organist, will conduct the choir. Mr. Owings is known throughout the Southeast for his organ concerts and choral conducting. He served Mt. Pleasant as interim organist and choirmaster in 2003. The concert is free and open to the public. Mt. Pleasant is located at 101 North Calhoun Street (corner of Hwy 378 and Calhoun) in downtown Saluda.

She initiated the Chapin Chirpers as a community women's singing group in 1984 and sang with the group until December 2008. The group continues in its ministry of singing in community events.
