"Adding Vocal Training to Choir Rehearsals" Guests Welcome

The opening program of the 2013-2014 AGO Program Year will take place on Saturday, September 14 at St. John's Episcopal Church. Clinicians Jessica Gibbons, Dr. Tina Stallard, and Dr. Susan Wyatt will address vocal concerns which will help build your church choir program. Dr. Wyatt, director of the Greater Columbia Children's Choir and the Chamber Choir of Kershaw County, will begin the day by discussing "How to Teach Children to Sing in Tune." Dr. Tina Stallard, professor of voice at USC, along with Jessica Gibbons, who works with the Choirs of Boys and Girls at Trinity Cathedral, will explore the topic "Vocal Pedagogy for the Young and Old Voice." This is the time to add a vocal pedagogy dimension to your church choir rehearsals. These engaging local experts will share valuable tips on strengthening and revitalizing your programs.

Finding God in Liturgy and Sacred Music

Saturday, September 7 12:15 – 4:00 p.m. Trinity Episcopal Cathedral 1100 Sumter Street, Columbia



This event has been planned especially for clergy, church musicians, choirs, & others who lead worship. Retired Archbishop of Canterbury George Carey will help us explore how liturgy nurtures and transforms. Lord Carey will be joined by workshop leaders Bishop Andrew Waldo, Dean Timothy Jones, Canon Choirmaster and Organist Jared Johnson, and internationally known organist and conductor Murray Forbes Somerville.

We will begin in the Cathedral at 1:00 pm with a noonday prayer service and a plenary address by Lord Carey; small group workshops will follow, and the afternoon will conclude with a question-&-answer period with Lord Carey. An optional light lunch will be served at 12:15 pm in Satterlee Hall. On Sunday, September 8, our regular 4:00 p.m. service of Choral Evensong will be replaced by a Hymn Festival, with sermon by Lord Carey; a reception will follow.





September "Adding Vocal Training to Choir Rehearsals" Local experts offer tips on vocal pedagogy for young and old voices. See separate article for details.

October "Deciphering the Code" Dr. Jerry Curry discusses ornamentation in the organ music of J.S. Bach and Francois Couperin. Tips on tempos and rhythms in *Messiah*. The program will be held in the historic Ebenezer Lutheran Chapel featuring the newly acquired harpsichord.

November "Weekend for High School Organists" Dr. Jared Johnson, adjunct professor of organ at USC, will lead a masterclass with high school organ students. Later that afternoon, last year's winner of the Young Organist Competition, Justin DuRant, will perform a recital.

January "Recital and Master Class" Dr. Patrick Scott (Myers Park Methodist Church in Charlotte, NC) will perform a recital on Friday evening. He will hold a masterclass on Saturday morning on improvisation. Dr. Scott holds the DMA degree from the University of Texas (Austin) where he studied with Gerre Hancock.

February "Master Class with Jack Mitchener" As part of a two-day workshop of the South Carolina Chapter of The Fellowship of United Methodists in Music and Worship Arts, Jack Mitchener, Professor of Organ at Mercer University in Macon, GA, will work with USC organ students.

March "Young Organist Competition" Now in its fourth year, the competition will once again feature young organists from the region in competition with monetary awards for the winners.

May "The Incomparable Wilma Jenson" Now 85 years old, Wilma Jenson is a legend in the organ world. She will perform a recital on Friday evening and offer a class on Saturday morning.
